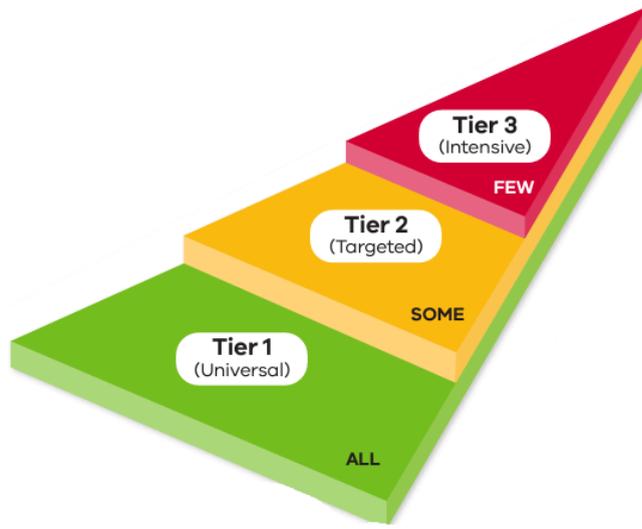
# اسکول بھر میں مثبت رویے کے لیے معاونت School Wide Positive

## Behaviour Support (SWPBS) کیا ہے؟

SWPBS اسکولوں کو تمام طلباء کے لیے ایک مثبت اور معاون جگہ بنانے میں مدد کرنے کا ایک طریقہ ہے۔ یہ اچھے رویے کی تعلیم دیتا ہے اور ان طلباء کو اضافی مدد فراہم کرتا ہے جنہیں اس کی ضرورت ہوتی ہے۔ یہ اسکول کو ہر ایک کے لیے بہتر بناتا ہے اور تمام طلباء کو برتاؤ، تندرست رہنے اور سیکھنے میں اپنی بہترین کوشش کرنے میں مدد کرتا ہے۔ یہ اساتذہ کو ان کے کلاس رومز کو مثبت اور تدریس پر توجہ مرکوز کرنے کے لیے ٹولز دے کر بھی مدد کرتا ہے۔

SWPBS مسائل کو تلاش کرنے اور حل کرنے کے لیے ایک کثیرالدرجہ سسٹم (نیچے دی گئی تصویر) اور ڈیٹا کا استعمال کرتا ہے۔

- درجہ 1: عام تعاون جو زیادہ تر طلباء کو کامیاب ہونے میں مدد کرتا ہے
- درجہ 2: ایسے طلباء کے لیے اضافی مدد جنہیں خطرہ درپیش ہو
- درجہ 3: زیادہ سنگین ضروریات والے طلباء کے لیے بھرپور تعاون

ہم توقعات کی میٹرکس (مخصوص اصولوں) کو طالب علموں کو ان اقدار کو ظاہر کرنے کا طریقہ سکھانے کے لیے بھی استعمال کرتے ہیں۔ انہیں تمام کلاس رومز میں تمام طلباء کو پڑھایا جاتا ہے، پریپ سے شروع ہو کر اور اسپیشلسٹ مضامین تک۔

## کلاس ڈوجو (Dojo)

جب کسی طالب علم کو اچھے رویے کے بعد انعام ملتا ہے، تو ان کی جانب سے اس رویے کو دہرانے کا زیادہ امکان ہوتا ہے۔ اپنے اسکول میں، ہم مثبت رویے کی حوصلہ افزائی کے لیے تعریف اور کلاس ڈوجو پوائنٹس کا استعمال کرتے ہیں۔ ہمارے اسکول کی اقدار پر مبنی متوقع طرز عمل ظاہر کرنے پر طلباء کلاس ڈوجو پوائنٹس حاصل کرتے ہیں۔ یہ پوائنٹس اسکول کے کسی بھی شعبے میں حاصل کیے جاسکتے ہیں اور طلباء اپنے پوائنٹس کا حساب رکھ سکتے ہیں۔ کافی پوائنٹس جمع کرنے کے بعد، طلباء ان کے بدلے انعامات لے سکتے ہیں۔ وہ اپنے انعامات کا انتخاب کرتے ہیں، جن کا جائزہ اور منظوری پھر ٹیم دیتی ہے۔ کلاسیں متوقع رویے دکھانے کے لیے مل کر کام کر کے گروپ انعامات بھی حاصل کر سکتی ہیں۔

والدین کے لیے کلاس ڈوجو ایپ اپنے بچے کے استاد سے بات کرنے اور اطلاعات حاصل کرنے کا ایک بہترین طریقہ ہے کہ وہ اسکول میں اچھا کام کر رہے ہیں۔ اس ایپ کے ذریعے والدین ایک بٹن پر کلک کر کے اسکول سے اعلانات کا بہت سی مختلف زبانوں میں ترجمہ کر سکتے ہیں۔

## SWPBS ایوارڈز

Barton پرائمری اسکول میں اسکول کی زندہ اقدار کی اہمیت کو ظاہر کرنے اور ان گروہوں اور افراد کا جشن منانے کے لیے ایوارڈز کا استعمال کیا جاتا ہے جو ان اقدار کو اپنانے کا اظہار کرتے ہیں۔ SWPBS ایوارڈز خاندانوں کے ساتھ "خوشخبری بانٹنے" کا ایک طریقہ ہیں۔ اپنے اسکول میں، ہم کلاس ایوارڈز اور انفرادی ایوارڈز دیتے ہیں۔

## غیر متوقع طرز عمل

Barton پرائمری اسکول میں، جب طلباء غلط برتاؤ کرتے ہیں، تو ہم اس رویے کو روکنے کے لیے سب سے پہلے فوری اور آسان ردعمل جیسے آنکھ سے رابطہ اور ہاتھ کے اشارے استعمال کرتے ہیں۔ اگر یہ رویہ جاری رہتا ہے، تو ہم اپنی میٹرکس سے مخصوص زبان کا استعمال کرتے ہوئے، طالب علم سے نجی طور پر بات کرتے ہیں، اور اپنے ردعمل کو اس بات کے موافق رکھتے ہیں کہ یہ سلوک کتنی بار اور کتنی شدت سے ہوتا ہے۔ اساتذہ تدریس اور طرز عمل کے بارے میں ہماری توقعات کو پورا کرنے کے لیے طالب علم کی کوششوں کی تعریف کرنے پر توجہ مرکوز رکھتے ہیں، اور ہمیشہ پرسکون رہتے ہیں۔

اسکول بھر میں چیزوں کو ہموار رکھنے اور اس بات کو یقینی بنانے کے لیے کہ کسی رویے سے ایک جیسے طریقے سے نمٹا جائے، ہم نے بنائی ہے معمولی اور سنگین رویوں کی میٹرکس۔ یہ میٹرکس عملے کو یہ فیصلہ کرنے میں مدد دیتی ہے کہ آیا کوئی رویہ چھوٹا (معمولی) ہے یا سنگین (بڑا) اور ان کی راہنمائی کرتی ہے کہ اس کا صحیح نتیجہ کیا ہونا چاہیے۔

## رویوں کو دوبارہ سکھانا

Barton پرائمری اسکول میں، اگر کوئی طالب علم متوقع رویے کی پیروی نہیں کرتا ہے، تو انہیں برتاؤ کرنے کا صحیح طریقہ دوبارہ سکھایا جا سکتا ہے۔ استاد مخصوص رویے کی وضاحت کرے گا، یہ دکھائے گا کہ اسے کیسے کرنا ہے، اور طالب علم کو فوری طور پر صحیح طرز عمل اختیار کرنے کی مشق کروائے گا۔ تمام عملے نے سیکھا ہوا ہے کہ رویے کو دوبارہ کیسے سکھانا ہے اور اس پر ہر روز عمل کرنا ہے۔ اگر کلاس روم میں دوبارہ سکھانے سے کام نہیں بنتا یا استاد فوراً ایسا نہیں کرپاتا، تو طالب علم کو اپنے وقفے کے دوران ری ٹیچ (Reteach) روم میں جانا پڑسکتا ہے۔

ری ٹیچ روم میں، عملہ یہ کرے گا:

- جو کچھ ہوا اس کے بارے میں طالب علم سے بات کرنا
- صحیح رویے پر بات چیت کرنا جسے سیکھنے کی ضرورت ہے
- والدین/سرپرستوں کو گھر بھیجنے کے لیے ایک فارم پُر کرنا
- طالب علم کو صحیح طرز عمل پر عمل پیرا ہونے میں مدد دینا
- ایسی کہانیاں پڑھ کر سنانا جو متوقع رویے کو دکھاتی ہوں
- جذبات کو سنبھالنے میں مدد کے لیے سکون اور حکمت عملیوں پر عمل پیرا ہونا

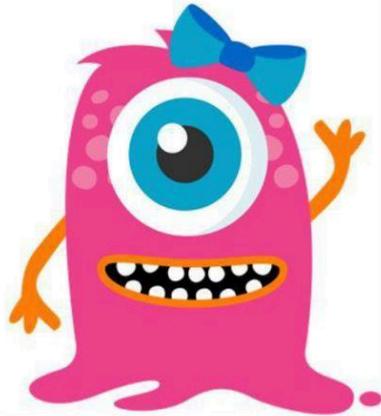

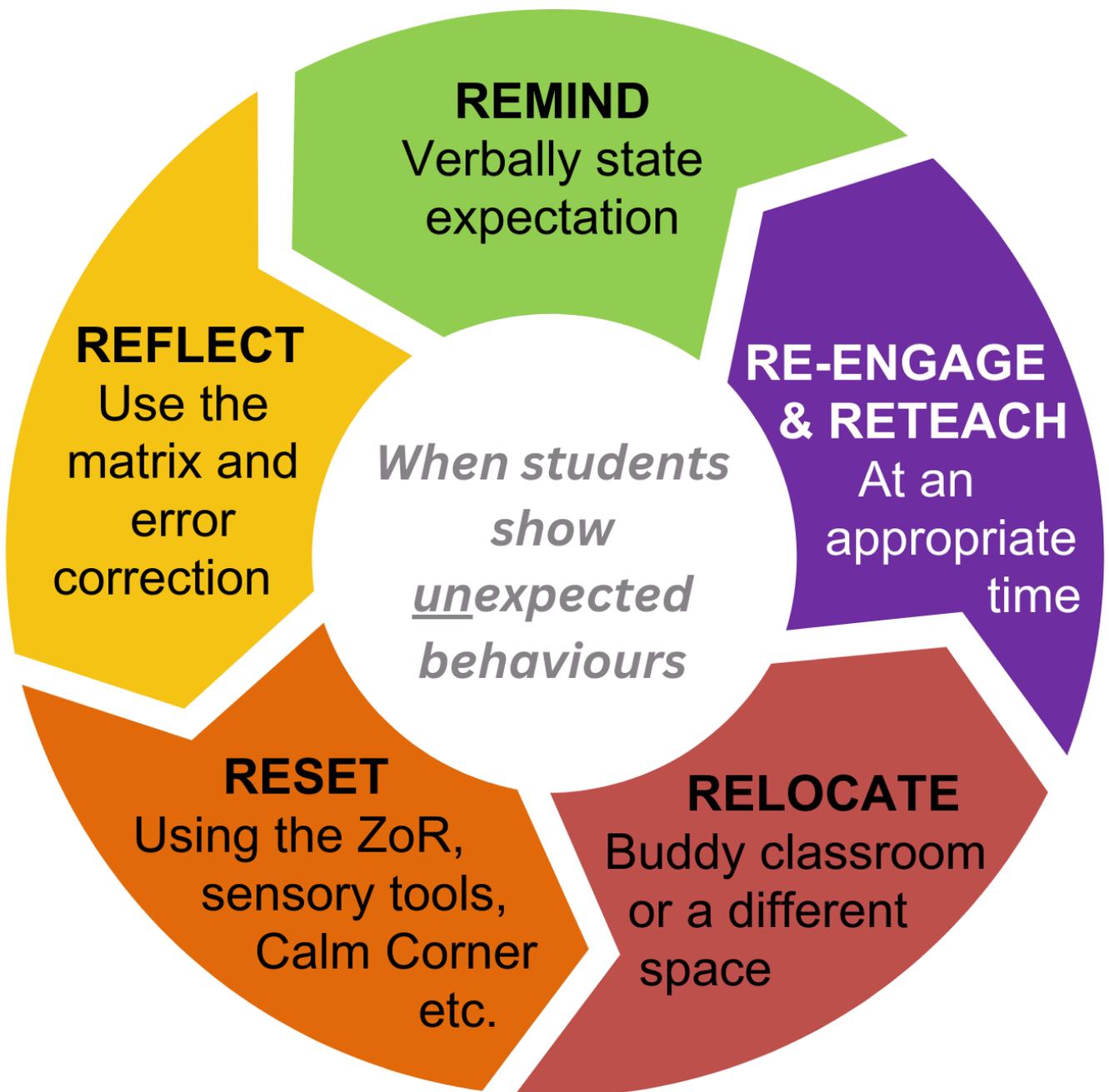

### Script for Acknowledging unexpected behaviours

For a **minor behaviour** - referral to the reteach room is not necessary

Observe unexpected minor behaviour.

Ask student to come over to speak with you away from their peers or address entire group

→ “One of our school values is (insert value). We can (insert value) by (insert expectation). I saw (describe observable behaviour).”

**REMIND**  
Verbally state expectation

Give student/s a chance to be heard.

Select from the following scripts based on :

1. “This is your **reminder** that I want to see you (insert expectation), because that (insert value explanation).”
2. Can you **reflect** with me about why it is important to (insert expectation)? (i.e. because that prevents others and yourself from harm).
3. I would like you to have a break and **reset** before you keep playing. You could go for a walk, go to the toilet or go and grab a drink. When you come back I want to see you (insert expectation), because that (insert value explanation).”

**REFLECT**  
Use the matrix and error correction

**RESET**  
Using the ZoR, sensory tools, Calm Corner etc.

For a **major behaviour** - referral to the reteach room is an option

Observe unexpected major behaviour.

Ask student to come over to speak with you away from their peers or address entire group

**RELOCATE**  
Buddy classroom or different space
